

PENNSYLVANIA STATE LAWS

ATVs may be operated:

1. On state-owned property on clearly marked and previously designated ATV trails;
- * 2. On highways and streets when necessary to cross a bridge or culvert;
- * 3. On highways and streets during periods of emergency when so declared by a governmental agency having jurisdiction;
- * 4. On highways and streets for special ATV events of limited duration that are conducted according to a prearranged schedule under permit from the governmental unit having jurisdiction

* **MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER.**

An ATV may make a direct crossing of a street or two-lane highway provided:

- The crossing is made at an angle of approximately 90 degrees to the direction of the highway, and at a place where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing;
- The ATV is brought to a complete stop before crossing the shoulder or highway;
- The driver yields the right-of-way to all oncoming traffic that constitutes an immediate hazard.
- In crossing a divided highway, the crossing is made only at an intersection of such highway with another public street or highway.
- Driver must be at least 16 years of age unless he has a safety certificate and is under the direct supervision of a person at least 18 years of age.

It is illegal to operate an ATV:

- On State Forest Roads open for use by licensed motor vehicles.
- At the rate of speed that is unreasonable or improper under existing conditions or in excess of the maximum limits posted for vehicular traffic;
- In a careless way so as to endanger the person or property of another;
- **While under the influence of alcohol, narcotics or drugs.**

OPERATION OF ATVs BY YOUTH

No one under 8 years of age shall operate an ATV on any state owned property. No person from age 8 to their 16th birthday shall operate an ATV except on lands of his parent or guardian, unless he or she has completed a prescribed ATV safety training course and received an ATV safety training certificate. Age 8 and 9 year old operators are restricted to an engine size of 70cc or less.

FINES

Failure to register your ATV or obtain liability insurance may result in a fine of \$300. A violation of other provisions of the Snowmobile/ATV Law is punishable by a fine of \$50 to \$200 plus the cost of prosecution for a first offense, and a fine of \$100 to \$300 plus the cost of prosecution for a second offense.

EQUIPMENT

All ATVs operating in Pennsylvania must be equipped with a brake system capable of producing deceleration of 14 feet per second at a speed of 20 miles per hour; and a muffler in good working order. The sound intensity produced by an ATV may not exceed 99dba, or decibels, when measured at 20 inches from the tailpipe. All ATVs operated during hours of darkness or when visibility is less than 500 feet must be equipped with an operating headlight and taillight. The headlight must produce a white light sufficient to reveal persons and vehicles at a distance of 100 feet. The taillight must produce a red light plainly visible during darkness from a distance of 500 feet.

PLEASE READ PASSENGER RULES AND REGULATIONS VERY CAREFULLY!!

- **PASSENGER UNDER 8 YEARS OF AGE CAN ONLY RIDE IN A SIDE BY SIDE ATV WITH A CHILD SAFETY SEAT, AS DESCRIBED BELOW.**
- **ANY CHILD UNDER 4 YEARS OF AGE, OR WEIGHING LESS THAN 40 LBS, OR UNDER THE HEIGHT OF 4 FOOT 9 INCHES TALL ARE REQUIRED TO USE A CHILD RESTRAINT DEVICE.**
- **ANY CHILD BETWEEN 4 AND UNDER 8 YEARS OF AGE WHO WEIGHS LESS THAN 80 LBS. AND/OR WHO IS UNDER 4 FOOT 9 INCHES IN HEIGHT MUST BE FASTEN IN A VEHICLE SEAT BELT SYSTEM WITH THE USE OF A BOOSTER SEAT.**
- **PASSENGERS 8 YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER MAY RIDE ON AN ATV WITH AN APPROVED AFTER MARKET SEAT ONLY.**
- **TOUR-DE-FOREST STAFF WILL BE WEARING "STAFF" VEST'S IF ANY HELP IS NEEDED.**
- **ALL RIDERS MUST STAY ON ROUTE AND FOLLOW ALL ROUTE SIGNING.**
- **IF YOU NEED TO STOP ALONG THE ROUTE, PULL OFF ONLY AS FAR AS NECESSARY TO AVOID BECOMING A HAZARD. (PICK A WIDE SPOT.)**
- **STAY OUT OF DITCHES AND SOFT AREAS.**
- **FOLLOW THE 25 MPH SPEED LIMIT ALONG THE ROUTE.**
- **WHEN IN TOWN STAY ON THE DESIGNATED ATV ROADS AND FOLLOW ALL TRAFFIC LAWS.**
- **FOLLOW THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC, MOST OF THE ROUTE IS ONE WAY STAY TO THE RIGHT.**
- **ALL RIDERS MUST CARRY PROOF OF INSURANCE, REGISTRATION (FROM PA OR A RECIPROCAL STATE)**

RECREATIONAL USE OF COLLINS PINE COMPANY LANDS

The forestry department of Collins Pine Company would like to take this opportunity to provide the following information about our company lands. Collins Pine Company is a privately owned company that has been in existence in Pennsylvania since 1855. Since that time the company has acquired ownership of 189 separate tracts totaling 122,000 acres located in seven counties of Northwestern Pennsylvania. The primary purpose of our land ownership is to grow and harvest timber on a sustainable basis. Most of our logs are processed at our Kane Hardwood facility in Kane, PA. We are not involved in any development programs, leasing programs or land sales.

We recognize that along with this land ownership comes a commitment to the neighboring communities, adjacent landowners and the public that may wish to use our land for recreational purposes. To comply with the laws, provide for safety, and maintain consistency throughout our ownership, the following policies have been developed:

1. All of our land is enrolled in the Forest Game Cooperative program with the PA Game Commission. This program ensures that all the land is open to the public for hunting, fishing and trapping without charge. The Game Commission enforces the applicable rules of the program.
2. The land is also open without charge for dispersed non-motorized recreation such as hiking, skiing or camping.
3. Most of our gated roads are opened during part of deer season so as to provide access to hunters by use of licensed, inspected and insured motor vehicles which are street legal in PA.
4. In accordance with PA State Law, ATVs, snowmobiles and other off road vehicles are not allowed to be operated at any time or place.
5. Dumping, littering and firewood cutting are also prohibited.
